## HEALTH BENEFITS by Jim Kerekes

• Went to the health seminar in Las Vegas. The information for 2025 hasn't come out from OPM yet. • NALC HB is owned and run by our national union. Members of other crafts have to pay our union dues and their own union to belong to our plan. • There are only 2 options next year. • Open season starts Monday. • OPM has decided that no health plan can change their plan for 2025. • There are a lot of additional things you can get with NALC High Option. You can see the additional benefits in the annual brochure. New for 2024: 2 sets of orthotics, a1c testing every year, hearing aids. •The health plan will give back \$50 per month for everyone who is covered by Medicare A & B. Premiums next year are \$174. • There is not much information about 2025. • Retirees, next year is open to add Medicare Part D for those who didn't have it before (no penalties).

• Had a really successful retirees' dinner. We learned to plan well in advance so we can properly advertise coming dinners. • Pocket calendars are available to the retirees and members (they are in the office). • Next month there will be many gifts to be given out to retirees in attendance.

## TREASURER by Mike Madsen

There is an expense report on the desk in the back of the room. • There was \$8,740 in progressive permissive remedies paid by the USPS last month. • Income last month was \$38,000. We spent \$2,749 more than we collected for the month.

# VICE PRESIDENT by Destiney Carrillo

• The rap session was great. She got a lot of new training material to use in the branch.

# **EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT** by Mike Hansen

• 2,760 grievances filed so far this year. • Rap session was successful. • Lite Blue is having trouble with new employees logging in. Stewards, tell your members to make sure they can log into Lite Blue. • Our branch is 89% organized but only 82% of the CCAs. We need to do better. • Now is a good time to explain to new people about the importance of donating to LCPF (off the clock). • President Renfro was present at the Rap Session and reviewed how the national negotiations were going. • A lot of agreements have been made already. • Heat training – considering national grievances to be filed, but not this year. • Collection boxes are going to have electronic locks. • The USPS is dramatically adding postal inspectors. Making penalties stronger for assaulting postal workers. • Combining stations into one building is going to happen more and more but we don't know how it will work. • All health benefits plans will change to a postal subset.

# **PRESIDENT** by Mike Wahlquist

• The Downtown office is going to be a hotspot - getting a new station manager, Alicia Turner. • Magna is a hotspot. Tom LaMont is going to assist steward Joe Horsley.

• <u>Cameras in vehicles</u> – this has been happening more and more. You should look for new little holes in your dashboards or other areas of the vehicle. Cameras can be added any time they want. If they think there may be a problem, they may send bait (drugs, valuables, etc.) through the mail. If you see/smell anything questionable, call your supervisor to get instructions about what to do. • He met with Tony Cline. They are sending all of Provo mail to Las Vegas to be processed (shutting down the plant in March). • Hiring is continuing to improve and we hope to have enough CCAs for the peak season. It seems they are hiring more.
